Back Country Horseman of Idaho (BCHI) Leave No Trace (LNT) Five Step training

BCHI LNT step training includes the Master Educator, the LNT Trainer, and LNT Awareness workshops. The Master Education course is the most advanced training, usually 5 days, and after completion, participants become LNT Master Educators. The Master Educator then goes go to teach the Trainer course and those participants then become LNT Trainers. Both the Master Educator and trainer are then are able to conduct LNT Awareness workshops to BCHI members or the public at large in support of BCHI Education mission statement. Back Country Horseman of Idaho (BCHI) Leave No Trace (LNT) training expectations

BCHI LNT Master Educators should successfully complete a minimum of 2 trainings and 1 public outreach with local land agencies annually, for a minimum duration of five years. BCHI does encourage LNT Master Educators to train beyond this timeframe, to include completion of LNT/Education refreshers courses as appropriate.

Examples of these annual trainings would be the LNT Trainer course, and/or LNT Awareness workshops. Examples of public outreach could be collaborative Leave No Trace Education trainings with local land agencies and/or the public.

BCHI LNT Trainers should successfully complete a minimum of 1 LNT Awareness workshop annually for a minimum duration of five years. BCHI does encourage LNT Trainers to train beyond this timeframe, to include completion of LNT/Education refresher courses as appropriate.
